Minister Carola Schouten of LNV (via NVWA) and Dier en Recht continue to take unreasonable action against the responsible breeders of short-nosed breeds who have been working according to the rules of the specialized bodies for many years. Many breed clubs have been promoting a good health policy for many years. And many breeders go even further than the mandatory studies to breed the healthiest dogs possible. Little or nothing is done about the core problem - illegal trade, bread breeding and breeders of extreme varieties that are not recognized. I have heard the people of the NVWA say that they focus on the registered (responsible) breeders because they do not have the capacity and strength to focus on the real problem. Below I have focused on our own breed because I can speak of it after more than 25 years from sufficient experience.

February 12, 2018 a discussion evening about the health and welfare of the French Bulldog with Animal & Law, the NVWA, judges, the Board of Directors, veterinarians, EGCN and I as an observer / secretary. That evening, agreements were made with Dier en Recht to adopt a restrained attitude while new regulations were to be worked on. 14 days later I accidentally receive an e-mail with this message from Dier en Recht: "We are going to start a new campaign with the RHW, a campaign against advertisements with short-nosed and pathetic dog breeds..." So far the agreements with Dier en Recht. On that evening (12-02-18) it was reported by the NVWA that the registered breeders would be tackled because those data are known. There was no capacity and decisiveness to do anything about illegal trade and bread breeding. This way we can endlessly continue the battle against our great breed that many people enjoy.
